- Diagnosed in **2023**.

8. Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD)

- Diagnosed in **2024**.
- Circulatory disorder affecting blood flow to extremities.

9. Peripheral Neuropathy

- Diagnosed in **2019**.
- Nerve damage causing pain, numbness, and weakness in limbs.

10. Autism (ASD)

- Diagnosed in **2022**.
- Sensory sensitivities, unique communication preferences.

11. **Complex PTSD**

- Diagnosed in **[year if known]**.
- CPTSD-related distress can **heighten physical symptoms, increase sensitivity to pain, and contribute to physiological stress responses.**

12. **Major Depressive Disorder (MDD)**

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Important Considerations for Treatment

- **Medication Sensitivities & Paradoxical Reactions:**
 - **Valium:** Severe agitation.
 - **Morphine:** Induces anxiety.
 - **Cannabis:** Triggers dissociative visual hallucinations.
 - **5-HTP:** Caused serotonin syndrome.
 - **Clonazepam:** Initially effective but caused permanent neurological damage after improper discontinuation.
- **Medical History & Care Barriers:**
 - Patient has **experienced challenges obtaining referrals to specialists** despite complex medical needs.
 - **Detailed documentation and careful review of medical history are appreciated** to ensure comprehensive and effective care.
- **Pain Management:**
 - History of reducing and discontinuing opioid use.
